



Château Magdeleine Bouhou Grand Vin 2014



“ From a high-quality plot, 90% Merlot, 10% Malbec. 35-year-old vines on clay and limestone. Yield 40.5 hl/ha. No herbicides. Fermented in small concrete vats with soft pigeage. 12-14 months in French oak barrels, 30% new. 50,000 bottles made. Consultant Stéphane Derenoncourt. To begin with much more closed on the nose than the gregarious Boha; blackcurrant leaf, rather than berry. With a bit of time, crushed elderberry begins to emerge, sweet and bitter and dark. Dry and leafy, with the lightest pencil sketch of dark fruit. As with the nose, elderberry dominates with its almost medicinal play across dark bitter-sweetness, something slightly liquorice, and more than a streak of green. Fine, shapely tannins but on the whole very lean. If you like your bordeaux on the austere side...
